

ELITE Player Expectations

- Players are expected to act as ELITE Ambassadors and be respectful at all times to coaches, referees, team players and opposing team players, on and off the field. This will be expected at all practices, games, tournaments, fund-raisers and any other ELITE activities.
- Players are expected to encourage all fellow ELITE teams and players, on and off the field.
- Players are expected to arrive on time for all practices and games, fully dressed, with an appropriate amount of water and with a positive attitude.
- Players or parents are expected to contact their coach as soon as possible if they have to miss or be late to a practice.
- Players or parents are expected to contact their coach as soon as possible if an emergency arises and conflicts with their attendance at an IPSL / ICCR league game or at a tournament.

For Parents and Players of ELITE Travel Teams

- Read and understand board policies regarding the Elite Travel Program, Competitive Tournament Play, Tryouts and team selection protocol, etc...
- Parents required to work a minimum of 4 hours / child for our tournament, “The Burlington Monster Match” held the weekend prior to Halloween.
- Players required to work at least 2 games as “Ball Boys & Ball Girls” at the National Adidas Tournament held at the Burlington Rec-Plex the end of April.
- Players required, adults encouraged, to participate at least 2 hours in our ELITE Recruiting Day held in May.
- Players and Parents are asked to *try* to be involved as much as possible and volunteer for committees, fund-raisers, our tournament, as a Team Parent, etc...
